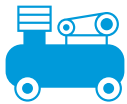
Lighting

Turn off lights when not in use and take advantage of natural light when available. You can install LED lamps, which can save you up to 50% on energy costs.



Plug loads

Turn off equipment and computers when not in use and make sure to have a preventative maintenance plan.



Compressed air

Test for air leaks and switch off compressors when not in use. Install zero loss drains on storage tanks as well as air nozzles on open-end terminals.



Doors and windows

Look for visual leaks around doors and windows. Caulk, repair or replace windows that leak air.



Hot water

Adjust your water temperature to 120° F. Add hot water pipe insulation.



Refrigeration

Check that seals are not torn or missing. Clean the coils and repair leaks.



HVAC

Cleaning and replacing your air filters quarterly, as well as sealing heating and cooling ducts, can help your HVAC system operate more efficiently and extend the life of your equipment. Use temperature setbacks when the space is not in use and low-pressure drop filters. Avoid simultaneous heating and cooling, which uses more energy.
